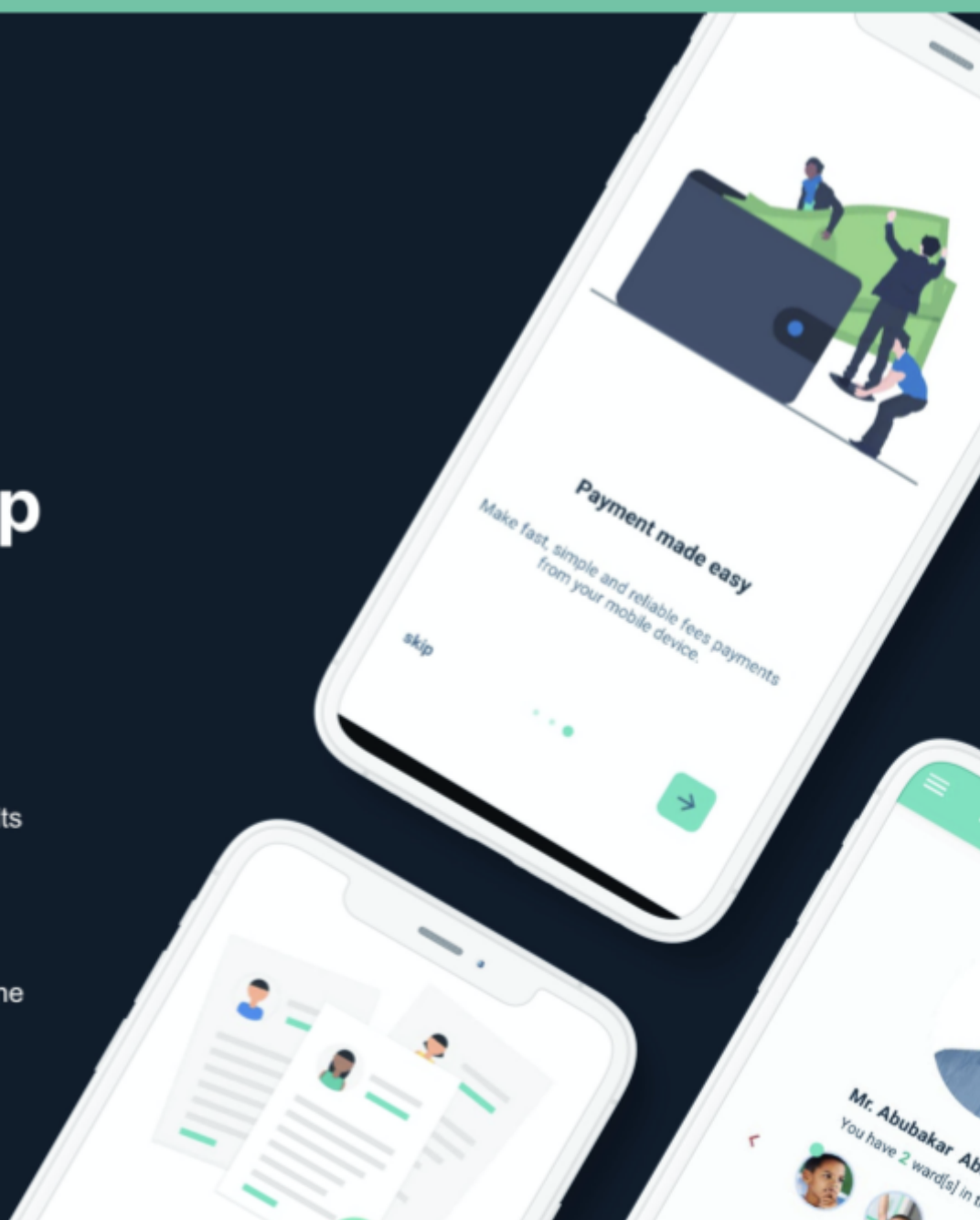

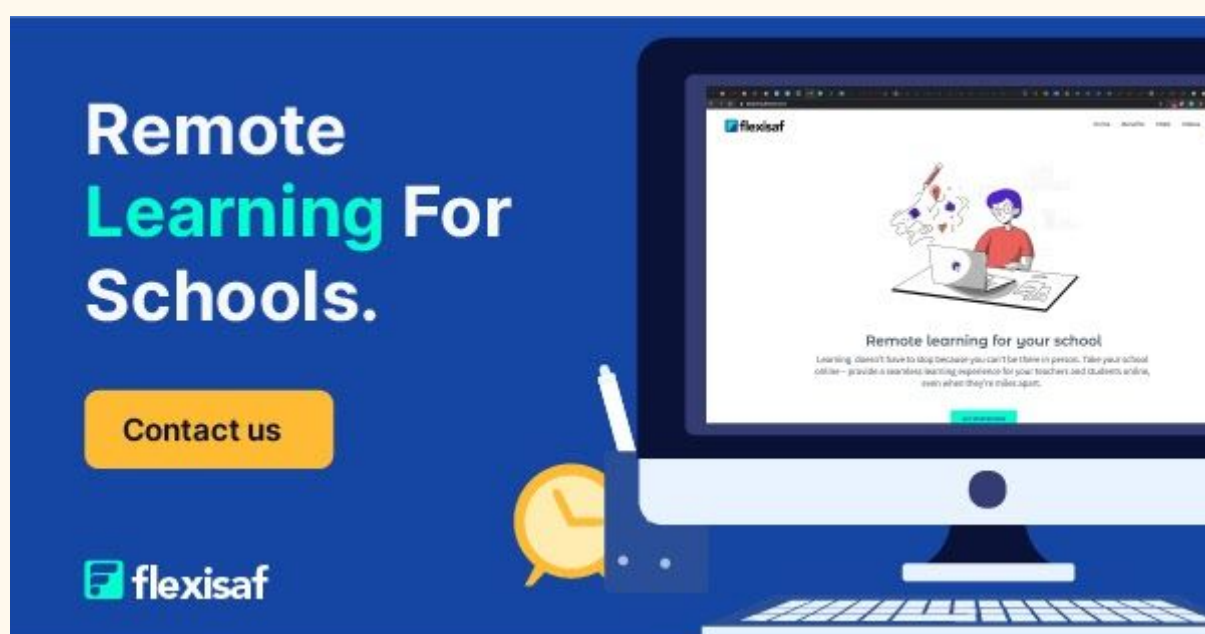

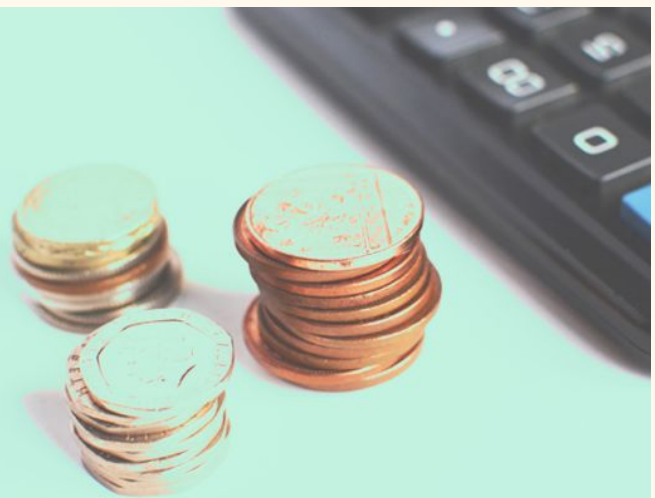

## eLearning for Kids:

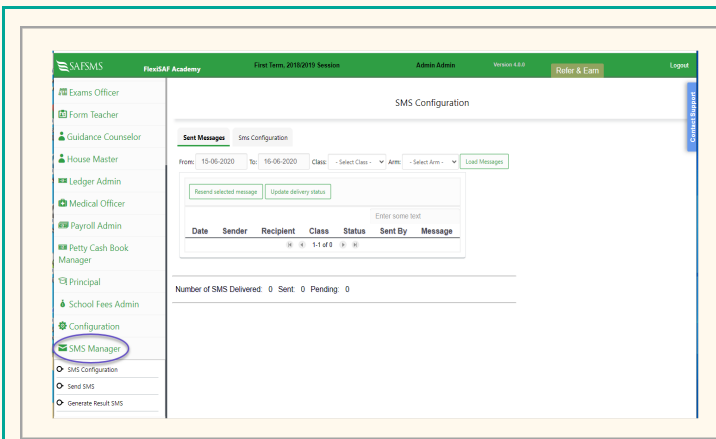
This platform offers short and effective lessons for kids of all grades and ages in 7 broad areas: Math, Science, Life Skills, Computer, Health, Environment and Language. Each lesson contains several short (less than 5 minutes) video exercises to keep the kids fully engaged the entire time. The videos are quite fun and are presented like stories with interactive questions for the kids. After a lesson is complete, your child receives a 'certificate' (how cute is that?) of completion and encouragement. 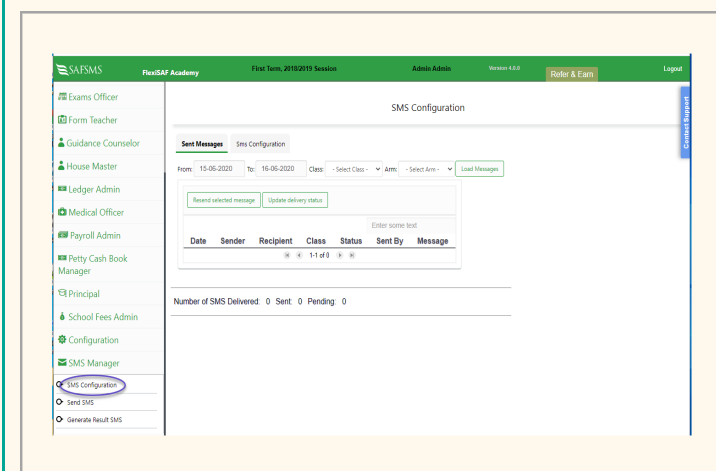

## How to Buy SAFSMS Credit

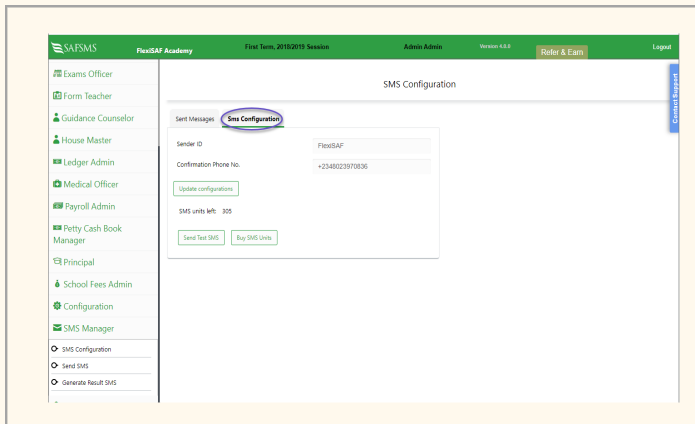
*Buying SAFSMS credit just got easier.*



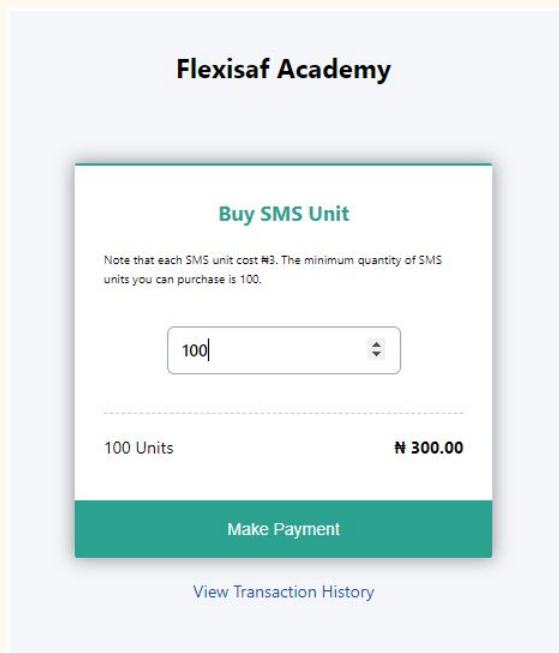
Step 1: Click **"SMS Manager"** on the left menu pane.



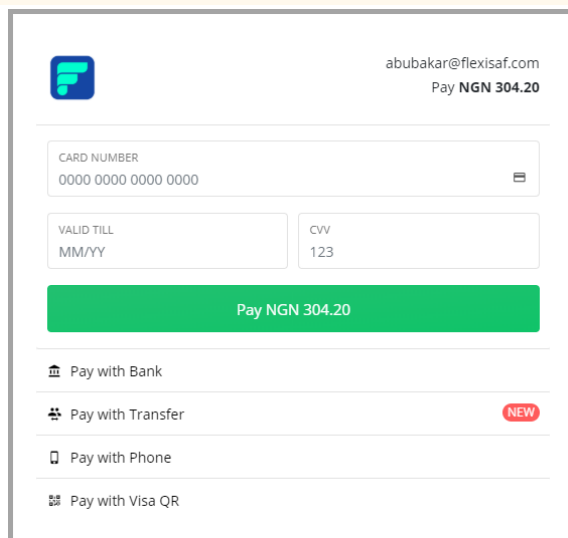
Step 2: Select **"SMS Configuration"**.
